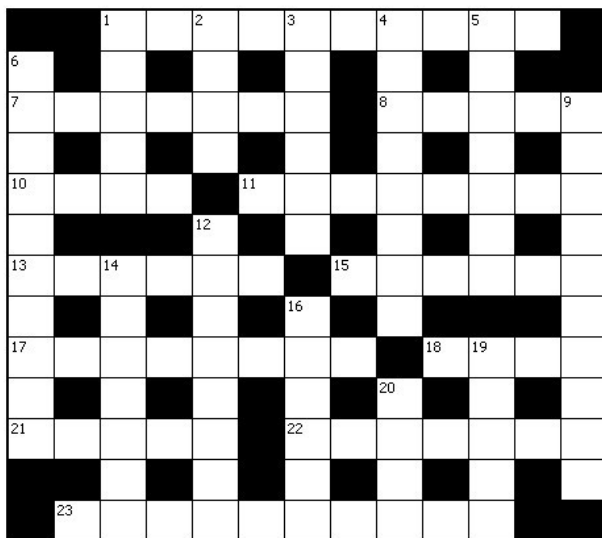

## Curate's Letter

Dear Friends,

A few weeks ago I was walking around... just coming back from the library. I can't remember what I was thinking then but I do remember one thing, there was a wee girl walking with her granny and, as I was passing them by, I heard the girl saying, 'Look, granny, that's the man from Jericho!' Now, that's something I had never been called before. So I turned and smiled and talked to them a while.

These encounters always warm your heart. And thinking about this encounter, one day I realised that it wasn't kind of an exception so I began to count them and had to add, children waving to me on the streets, at Spring Fairs, in the supermarkets, etc. Now, certainly I don't consider myself a celebrity and I have to say that the same has happened to a few of you too. Those who have had the experience can tell of the joy that fills the heart. It is a sweet joy, one that comes from the Lord.

Now, the explanation for that description of me ('... *that's the man from Jericho!*') was of course very simple. She might not have remembered my name, but she did remember my face... and a lesson she had heard in Messy Church once. The lesson was about Joshua... and the battle of Jericho.

As for the rest of the children, their reason was very similar: assemblies in Schools, Messy Church, our Holy Week Bible Club 'Going Bananas,' etc. That same reason has made children wave and greet some of you too. They point at you and show you to their parents. They remember! Those I've seen working faithfully at CSSM must know too what I'm writing about. Some seeds planted in their hearts are still there, with life in them. How encouraging and beautiful this is. But then, what a responsibility too! How many think that once they go out into the world, they become anonymous, that nobody notices them. How many think they are not even noticed in the Church! But I tell you, there are always others looking at us. And how true this is regarding children! We are their example... and I pray the Lord will give wisdom and grace, especially to the young ones, so they will be able to discern in what ways we, unworthy ones, by the mercy of God might be examples to follow. May He give them wisdom and grace also to love us even when learning in what ways we provide examples of what not to cultivate. May God give us grace to walk in His ways with love!

*"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father Who is in Heaven."* (Matthew 5:14-16)

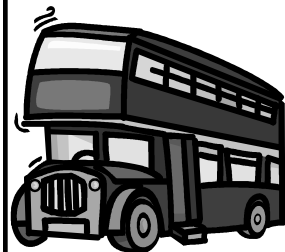


## **THURSDAY CLUB**

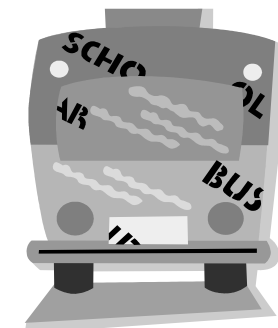

Hoping the weather on the day will be kind to us and we plan to return to Knockbreda at 5.00pm approx.

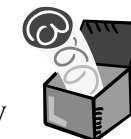

## **THE LARDER** (St Christopher's, Mersey Street)

Thank you for allowing me to share some of our story about the Larder on Sunday 6 April. It was great being with you. Many of you asked genuine questions about how to help so here is some information.

The Larder is an attempt to help people who find themselves in food poverty. This may be caused by a change in circumstances, a delay in benefit payments, loss of job, or an unexpected emergency like a washing machine breakdown or illness.

St Christopher's in Mersey Street, Ballymacarrett, has organised a collection and sorting point for food. Local Ministers, community/social workers and health professionals can all refer anyone in need to The Larder. A card is filled in and the client simply turns up. We aim to feed an individual or family for five to seven days.

Any support will be warmly received by The Larder and even more so by the people who really need a wee helping hand in moment of crisis. We publish news in The Larder facebook group.

Deliveries can be made to St Christopher's on Tuesdays and Fridays between 10am and 12 noon and on Thursday nights between 8pm and 9pm.

Here is a list of stuff that would really help –

Cereal •Jam •Pasta •Rice •Pasta Sauces and Curry sauces •Tinned meat / fish •Tinned vegetables, soup, beans and tomatoes •Biscuits •Tea and coffee •Toilet roll •Washing Powder •Toothbrushes •Toiletries •Washing up liquid •Washing powder

We repack anything in large quantities like washing powder, toilet rolls etc, so it goes round more people.
